



Checklist for parents of Dutch nationals under 18 applying for a visa

- Applications must be submitted in person.
- For every document, you must provide the original and one photocopy.
- The documents must have been drawn up in Dutch, English, French or Spanish (or have been translated into one of these languages)
- The documents will not be returned, with the exception of travel documents and original source documents such as birth certificates and marriage certificates.

1. Application form

- 1.1 Completed and signed [Schengen visa application form](#).

2. Travel documents

- 2.1 A passport or other valid travel document.

Please note:

- Your travel document must have at least two empty visa pages.
- Your travel document must not be more than 10 years old.
- Your travel document must be valid for at least three months following the date of departure from the Schengen area.

- 2.2 Photocopy of your child's Dutch passport.

- 2.3 Photocopy of the passport of the child's Dutch parent. If the Dutch parent has died or does not have parental responsibility, provide documentation that proves this

5. Proof of long-term relationship with your child

5.1 If your Dutch child does not live with you, but elsewhere – such as in the Netherlands – you will need to provide proof that you have had long-term contact with them. This can be in the form of: written communication, financial support, visits, telephone calls, etc.

6. Proof of travel

Note: make travel reservations which you can cancel, in case your visa request will be refused.

7. Proof of health insurance

An official document from your insurer showing that:

7.1 The insurance policy has been taken out in your name.

- 7.2 Your insurance is valid throughout the Schengen area and for the duration of your stay.

- 7.3 At least 30.000 euro of medical costs are reimbursed, including hospital care, emergency treatment and repatriation (including in the event of death). If your insurer will not provide an official document of this nature, you should take out travel insurance with appropriate medical coverage for this trip with one that does.

Please note the following:

- To apply for a visa you will need to hand in your passport (or travel document) and wait for it to be returned.
- The competent authorities can also ask you to provide additional supporting documents.
- If you submit your application to an external service provider such as VFS Global or TLScontact, you will need to pay service costs.
- If your application is rejected, any fees paid will not be refunded.
